Battle of Crete Memorial Dedication Ceremony

10:00 am Saturday 11 May 2024 Saw Avenue Precinct Kings Park WA

Welcome

On a very pleasant Saturday morning over 400 people joined the Committee to celebrate the dedication of the Battle of Crete Memorial in the Saw Avenue memorial precinct in King's Park.

The Committee was very proud to hear the very positive praise expressed by our invited dignitaries in their speeches. Without exception all believed the design of the memorial was of an excellent standard, befitting the significance that the *Battle of Crete* has to Australian and Greek military history.

The presence of the highly ranked overseas contingent at this ceremony highlights the strong bonds that have developed between Greece, Australia, and New Zealand. There is little doubt that the ANZAC involvement in Greece and Crete contributed to the Greek migration to Australia and New Zealand in the years immediately following the second world war.

The Committee was both very surprised and grateful for the large number of distinguished guests who chose to support the ceremony by their attendance. Over 30 guests made themselves available.

The well-known TV and radio personality Gary Mitchell very capably performed the duties of master of ceremony for the event.

Arthur Leggett OAM, the 105-year-old veteran was our guest of honour. He was a former member of 2/11Bn AIF. Arthur who is one of the two remaining Australian survivors of the Battle of Crete was taken captive by German Paratroopers and spent more than four years in a prisoner of war camp. The mere fact that he was able to be present was an honour. Arthur recited the Ode of Remembrance and was able lay a wreath.

Welcome to Country was presented by Ms Di Ryder OAM, a well known and respected Noongar Elder. She also informed the audience about the little-known facts about the number of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders who participated in the battle. Di also served in the ADF.



Speeches

After thanking and welcoming the long list of distinguished guests, Bill Evangel asked each member of the Committee to identify themselves by standing. He noted that a great deal of hard work was needed by the Committee to bring the memorial to this stage. He thanked everyone for taking the time to attend the function with specific reference to relatives of veterans and particularly those who travelled long distances. Bill is currently President of the Greek Australian Returned and Services League and Chairperson of the Battle of Crete Memorial Committee.

Bill thanked Smith Sculptors for their outstanding work in designing the memorial and Colgan Industries for executing the construction and installation phase of the project.

Fly Past

Fly pasts have been traditionally performed by the military around the word as a mark of respect for individuals, organizations and public events. The nature of the fly past varies according to the event in question and can involve a number and type of aircraft.

In this case the RAAF indicated that it wanted to support the dedication and pay its respects by allowing a single aircraft, a PC21 from Pearce Airbase to travel North to South over the memorial. At approximately 11:10 am the aircraft flew over Kings Park much to the amazement of the crowd.

Flt LT James Pears who flew the plane commented afterwards that he was very honored to be given the task and enjoyed executing it.

The Committee thanks the RAAF for this very important gesture which had a great impact on the ceremony.


Wreath laying Ceremony.






The Governor and Premier Lay Their Wreaths




